The Rev. R. B. WILSON was a master at the Newcastle-under-Lyme Orme Boys' School during the 7 years from January, 1920, to April, 1927. He was more particularly concerned with the teaching of Geography, which rapidly became a strong subject in the school. Under him Geography became a principal subject for the Higher School Certificate examination, and in 1924 the Board recognised an advanced course in this subject. The course developed so rapidly that the teaching of the two years was separated in the year following. Highly successful results were obtained at the Northern Universities' Higher School Certificate examination; only once has a boy failed in Geography.

Mr. Wilson's great ability in organising was not limited to Geography. He took a prominent part in all the school activities, which were put on a sound footing with his assistance. In all that he undertook he came to enjoy the complete confidence of the boys and of their parents. I am sure that those high qualities, which rendered his work here so successful, will serve him in good stead whatever may be the duties he is called upon to fulfil.
